




- Crown Hill is the largest green space inside the I-465 beltway circling Indianapolis.
- More than 4,100 inventoried trees featuring 130 distinct species grace Crown Hill's 555 acres.
- Crown Hill makes up a significant portion of Indianapolis' urban forest and provides a sizable urban canopy that sustains diverse populations of migratory birds and wildlife including a herd of white-tailed deer.
- The trees of Crown Hill provide an oasis of calm in a bustling urban setting where visitors can experience the beauty, power and mysteries of nature.
- Ginkgo, Carolina silverbell, Golden rain tree, American holly, Kentucky coffeetree, Weeping European beech, American hornbeam, Mockernut hickory, Tuliptree, Eastern cottonwood, Sycamore, Oak and more wait to greet you.
